

## To get started you will need...

- Metallic Foil Paper 136713 or Christmas Patty Pans 182501
- Kids PVA Glue 085746



## step-by-step

- You can make these Christmas Baubles any size. Small ones to decorate the tree, large ones to decorate a room, you can also experiment with different coloured papers and cards.
- To begin with, draw an equilateral triangle. Use a ruler and a compass to form an equilateral triangle.
- Next, draw a circle around the triangle so that the edges of the circle just touch the corners of the triangle. Then we cut the circle out using a pair of scissors.
- These three edges have to be folded in to form a triangle.

## step-by-step

- Once this was complete we used this circle as a template to make 20 circles which we drew onto Metallic Foil Paper. Alternatively you could use Christmas Patty Pans.
- All 20 circles need triangle folds inside them. The coloured side of the Metallic Foil Paper needs to be face up.
- To construct the ball we simply lift the circle sides on two pieces so that it stands up and forms a ridge. The folded triangle sides stick together, this is where you place the Kids PVA Glue so that they can stick.
- Join five triangles together so that it forms a dome shape. Make two more domes, each with five triangles joined together. Then join the 3 domes together.
- Check around your ball. Each triangle has to be part of a dome where five triangles meet.
- Add the remaining triangles to the places on your ball where there are few triangles. Tuck some ribbon for hanging between two joining triangles before sticking together.
- Eventually you will have used up all of the triangles and your ball will be complete.
