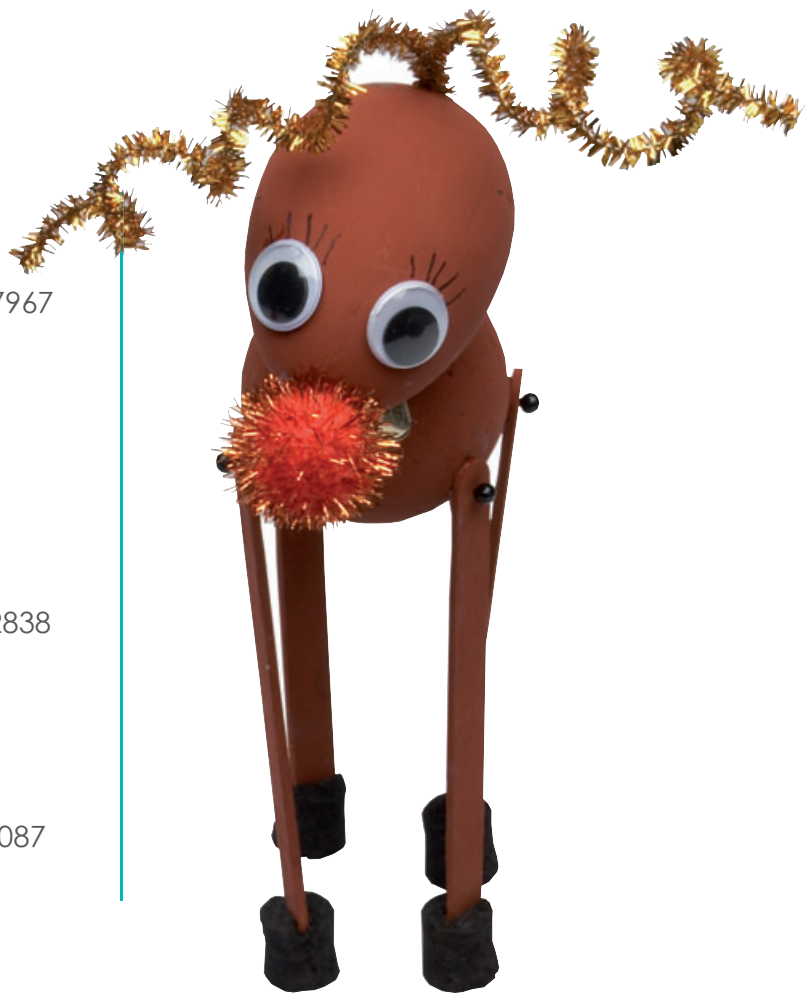


To get started you will need...

- Decofoam Ball 137075
- Liquicryl 5 Litre Burnt Sienna 227967
- Plastic Eggs 002444
- Craft Sticks 001164
- Cork Stoppers 302380
- Kids PVA Glue 085746
- Black Wiggle Eyes 002089
- Christmas Glitter Pom Poms 042838
- Tinsel Pipe Cleaners 003194
- Coloured Jingle Bells 204222
- Red Satin Ribbon 205211
- Crayola Washable Markers 116087
- Kindergarten Scissors 147553
- Liquicryl 5 Litre Black 227959



step-by-step

- To make our Plastic Egg Rudolph we painted a Decofoam Ball with Liquicryl 5 Litre Burnt Sienna. This will be used for the body. We also painted a Plastic Egg for the head and four Craft Sticks for the legs.
- Paint four Small Cork Stoppers with Liquicryl 5 Litre Black for the feet. Wait for these to dry.
- With an adult's supervision cut a groove in the tops of your four painted Small Cork Stoppers.
- Now push a Craft Stick into the top of each Cork Stopper's groove. Use Kids PVA Glue to secure these in place.

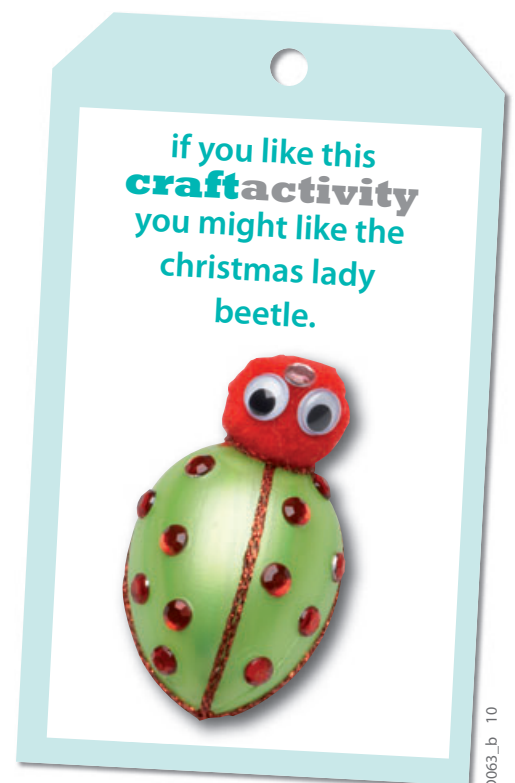

step-by-step

- Glue the tops of the legs to your painted Decofoam Ball. You may need to hold them in place for a few seconds. We used pins to keep them in place.
- Using Kids PVA Glue attach two Black Wiggle Eyes to the face of your Plastic Egg. Then draw on eye lashes with a Black Marker. You can also attach a red Christmas Glitter Pom Poms as a nose.
- Next, attach your Plastic Egg head to the Decofoam Ball using Kids PVA Glue. You may need to hold them in place for a few seconds.
- Wrap a gold Tinsel Pipe Cleaner around your finger to form a coil. Fold the Tinsel Pipe Cleaner in half and secure it to the back of Plastic Egg using Kids PVA Glue .
- Lastly, tie a Gold Coloured Jingle Bell around Rudolph's neck using Red Satin Ribbon.
- Rudolph is now finished, and ready to be put on display for Christmas.
